Parks Update

March 2022

Davies Beach: The Lake Stevens Police Department and Snohomish Regional Fire need to relocate the marine unit watercrafts that are currently housed at North Cove Park due to conflict of use now that the swimming area is open. The police department has conducted an analysis of other water access sites available on Lake Stevens and has selected Davies Beach due to its location and improved response times to incidents occurring on the lake. This location also provides better access for contact with recreational boaters to perform routine safety inspections and education. The project will include moving the boat lift from North Cove and installing it at Davies Beach and fencing some of the existing berths. Snohomish Regional Fire will also relocate their boat to the same location.

North Cove Guest Moorage Grant: Staff was notified by the Recreation Conservation Office (RCO) that Lake Stevens has been awarded a boating facility grant for the installation of day-use guest moorage. The preliminary timeline for construction will be 2023-2024.

Sunset Park: Staff is working with a consultant to provide a scope for the redevelopment of this park. Early actions will be to determine the structural stability of the shoreline and dock.

Cedarwood Community Center: Staff met with a structural engineer and toured the facility to determine next steps and scope. The City's request did not make it into the budget this year, but the city will move forward with the structural analysis and planning

efforts until the construction budget becomes available.

Trail Master Program: Staff is working through the acquisition of easements to construct phase I of the Trails Master Plan along the utility corridor adjacent to 20th Street Ballfields. On March 8, the City Council adopted a condemnation ordinance for the easements required for the trail construction on the Quail Court and Willowood open space tracts.

Centennial Woods: Feasibility of this site is on the work program for 3rd quarter of this year.

Events, Recreation & Culture:

- The proposals received from the community for festivals, events and recreation were:

Paddleboard rentals at Lundeen park
Film Festival in the Mill
Health and Wellness Fair
Lake Stevens High School Band & Choir Showcase
Zumba Dance Fit Classes
Youth Athletic Recreation Classes

Staff will be working on the contracts for these offerings.

- The Water Tower art project is in production and will be installed adjacent to the bridge deck in North Cove at the intersection of Main and N. Lakeshore.
- Lake Stevens Police Department hosted the first annual Polar Plunge on February 27, 2022. Councilmembers Jorstad and Dickenson joined Police Chief Beazizo and police department staff in raising money for the Special Olympics. Special thanks to Evidence Technician Deb Smith for organizing this event.
- On March 6th, Evergreen Dive Service cleaned up the boat launch at Davies Beach.
