RECOMMENDATION(S)/ACTION REQUESTED:

Public Works staff are requesting discussion and guidance from the Council on preliminary designs for six projects identified to reroute the Lake Stevens Outlet Channel, enhance aquatic habitat, address flooding, and upgrade infrastructure.

SUMMARY/BACKGROUND:

City staff have been working with Davido Consulting Group (DCG) to develop preliminary designs for six projects identified in the downtown Lake Stevens area. The projects are focused on a partial reroute of the Lake Stevens Outlet Channel, water crossing infrastructure improvements, upgrade to the existing weir, flood mitigation and aquatic habitat enhancement. These projects were presented to Council at the February 11th Council Retreat.

The City and DCG held a kickoff meeting with members from the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife and the Tulalip Tribe to discuss the preliminary design approach for each of the projects identified. Staff will update the Council at the workshop on the discussion topics at the kickoff meeting. This presentation will also include an overview of the current status of each of the project designs and the next steps in the preliminary design process.
